ACTIVITIES

By-Laws were accepted at the annual meeting.

Exploration re Dataw Island Club membership as a full fledged club began after Harriette Buchanan suggested we do so. September 2004 Visual Arts Committee approved basic by-laws were patterned after the Dataw Island Tennis Association's laws and we presented our desire to become a DIC club. Dues were set at \$10/pp. An official mission statement was adopted. VAC leaders will transfer titles to board and club officers. In October, the Recreation Committee voted to allow VAC club status. In January 2005 a general election was to take place.

30 members October 2004 - \$91 in treasury, Carol Mc Arthur opened VAC checking account.

Voted to continue exhibits at regular intervals. Rules for exhibits included release form and transfer of art to VAC @ 10% October 2004 ... Entries not more than 2 of recent artworks. Developed off campus artist fees with Kevin Ennis and Recreation Committee

Protocol was developed for Gallery Manager as liaison between artist and "buyer": Sandra Johnston filled that position.

Dateline articles created by Lynn Brown and included in Community Center page. Announcements are placed with Happy Petry for Channel 7 (Comcast) airing. Investigation of member driven and "affordable" outside artist workshops was explored. Workshops include Tuesday "together" painting,

Purchased hanging rods and clips for 2 walls; then hanging system for remaining wall for photography exhibit in October; track lighting for A&C Room; corner shelving and installed bulletin board. Ennis donated a large case for display of VAC artwork for the Atrium.

October VAC donated Harvey Wallbanger/Mona Lisa cake to Dataw Dames and Dandies Cake Sale (VAC's table donated proceeds over \$600)

Joni Bishop (10/5/2004), a guitarist and guest of the Cannery folk music series played guitar and shared her paintings on wood at the Monday morning workshop. Kelson Slayman coordinated the event.

January 4, 2005 VAC first annual meeting speaker was Dataw resident Carl Kraybill, nationally known landscape artist (MFA Kent University, Shaker Heights, OH teacher represented in Ford Motor Company, Cleveland clinic Foundation, Butler Museum of Art and more). Carl lectured on "Perception: how visual arts relate to our environment." VAC gave him a Bateaux \$100 gift certificate as an honorarium. A wine, champagne and hors d'ouvres reception followed.
